Migrant Help offers support and advice with all issues regarding the asylum process and beyond. It is important that you go to Migrant Help to report issues with your accommodation, and any other advice needed during your asylum journey. Migrant Help provides advice, information and support to negotiate the asylum

system, access services and overcome the challenges of integration.

© The Home Office (UKVI)

The Home office is ultimately responsible for the accommodation you are living in and your financial support. The Home Office is the lead UK government department for immigration and visas, passports, policing, fire and rescue services and ensuring that UK citizens are protected. The area of the Home Office that you will be directly dealing with is called UK Visas & Immigration.

© Craven Refugee Support Network (CRSN) are a collection of groups around Yorkshire which aim to support refugees, raise money and awareness, and provide financial support to refugee organisations.

Staying Safe

The UK is generally a safe place. However, you should be aware of your surroundings and be conscious of your own safety.

Some tips for keeping safe are:-

- Tell someone where you are going and what time you are coming back.
- Try to walk in areas where there are other people around.
- When walking at night, stick to well-lit routes even if it is a longer journey.
- Be cautious if a stranger wants to give you money, expensive gifts, offers you work or somewhere to stay.
- If you have a phone, make sure it is charged and has credit in case you need to use it
- Keep all valuables including your phone safe. Beware of pickpockets.
- At any time, you can ask a police officer, a Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) or even a bus driver for assistance.

Making a complaint

If you feel that you haven't been treated fairly or haven't received a service you have a right to - you can make a complaint. If you would like to make a complaint about any of the organisations in this pack, you should do this through Migrant Help as soon as you can.

If you raise a complaint this will not affect your asylum claim or entitlement to support. You should feel comfortable knowing that any complaints received are taken seriously and investigated by the relevant organisations.

It is important that if you want to make a complaint, to make it as soon as possible. Feedback and complaints are welcomed as they help improve the services that are provided. To do this call o808 8010 503, or download the feedback or complaints form from the Migrant Help website. The complaint raised will be resolved by Migrant Help directly or they will make sure that your housing provider will deal with it.



Aspen Card

The Asylum Support Enablement Card (ASPEN) is a prepaid debit card that provides weekly support payments to asylum seekers in the UK.



- **How it works:** The UK government loads weekly support payments onto your card. The card can be used in shops and ATMs that accept Visa. The card can be used to buy goods and withdraw cash.
- Who can get an Aspen card: Asylum seekers who receive section 95, or section 4, support will receive an Aspen card.
- **How to use the card:** You can use the card to check your balance, activate your card, and report a lost or stolen card. You can get help with payments and questions.
- **Limitations:** Not all ATMs can be used, and there might be extra fees. Those with section 4 support cannot take out cash. The card can only be used in person. Contactless payments under £100 are allowed.





When your referral is received you can visit the shop once a week to choose 10 items for £5.

If you do not know the fare, tell the driver where you are going and he will tell you the cost. To tell the driver that you want to get off the bus at the next stop you must press the bell.

Education

Attending school is compulsory in the United Kingdom for children aged between 5 years and 16 years. School days are approximately 6 hours long, Monday to Friday. There are several ways in which you can register your children for education.

☺ Contact the School Admissions Team – You can apply online through a Bradford Council website: www.bradford.gov.uk/admissions.

If you need to apply for a place once the school year has started, you apply through email: schooladmissions@braford.gov.uk, or Tel: 01274-439200. Catholic Schools have their own process so you would have to go direct. If you are applying for a faith school, you need to fill out a SIF form available from the council website, or from the school direct.

Documents needed:

- 1) Child's legal name;
- 2) Date of birth;
- 3) Main address; and
- 4) proof of parental responsibility.

Post 16

You can leave school on the last Friday in June if you'll be 16 by the end of the summer holidays. You must then do one of the following until you're 18:

- stay in full-time education, for example at a college
- start an apprenticeship or traineeship
- spend 20 hours or more a week working or volunteering, while in part-time education or training.

Offers a range of provision to young people which includes:

Open Access Provision (OA): if you are of secondary school age you can just turn up and get involved in these sessions – we plan together to keep things interesting.

Emergency Services

If it is not an immediate emergency and you need to see a doctor, but you are unable to contact your GP or dentist, or if it is out of hours, you need to call 111 for an emergency appointment. 111 has interpreters to assist you if you need translation help. Emergency services can be contacted by dialling 999. These calls are free. Tell them which service you need, and they will connect you.

Ambulance

In a life-threatening emergency - if someone is seriously ill or injured, and their life is at risk – dial 999 and ask for the Ambulance Service.

In a medical emergency you can also go directly to a hospital. Hospitals in the Keighley area which have Accident and Emergency (A&E) services are listed below:

© Police

The police can help you in emergencies such as violence, robbery or where someone has committed a crime. There are two numbers to contact the police:

- 999 To be used in real emergencies, where the police need to attend urgently. For example, serious assault, rape or where there is danger to life
- 101 For non-emergencies and to report crimes that do not need an immediate police response. For example, damage to your property or suspected drug dealing in your area. 101 is also the number to contact your local police station.

Keighley Library, North Street, BD21 3SX. It is open Monday to Friday: 9am-7pm and Saturday: 9am-5pm.
